Seniors go top of Division 1B

The senior men's team went top of Division 1B this week with a hard-fought victory away to Tír na nÓg. Meanwhile wins for our senior camogs and detail on matches from our junior and ladies team as well as our bulletin mailing list can be found below.

Seniors earn full points in Portadown

Killeavy travelled to Portadown for their first away game of the season against Tír na nÓg on Sunday past and got off to a whirlwind start with fine points from Caolan McConville and Cathal Boylan. The home side traded points to leave the scoreboard 0-03 to 0-01 after 15 minutes. It was then that the best move of the half began, deep in the Killeavy half: intricate, off-the-shoulder running allowed for Miceal McNamee to break away from the high press at top speed. Looking up he picked out Niall O' Neill who had worked hard to get free at 14 and, after rounding his man, calmly played the ball across to Paul Quinn to duly dispatch into the net. A further two points saw Killeavy leading by 1-05 to 0-2 and the game looked well in control. A lapse in concentration from the Killeavy defence however allowed a high ball in to break and be finished to an open net and when accompanied by a further point the teams went in with only two between them: 1-05 to 1-03.

The second half proved difficult for both teams as frustrated attacks left tension among both players and supporters alike. Missed opportunities and poor shot selection were the story of the first 20 minutes. A goal from Tir na nÓg seemed to awaken a hitherto dormant Killeavy attack who suddenly realised, having dominated the game that they could be looking at their first defeat of the season. Excellent points from captain James Donnelly, Cathal Boylan, Caolan McConville and Niall O'Neill saw the visitors regain control as the Killeavy defence battened down the hatches to see out a nervous last few minutes. The final whistle then sounded to the relief of all travelling supporters as Killeavy chalked up their second win in a row to go top of Division 1B on a scoreline of 1-10 to 2-03. This week Killeavy play at home to rivals and fellow promoted Silverbridge in a replay of last year's Intermediate Final. This is an important game that would see Killeavy either extend their lead at the top to three points or drop to second or third depending on results elsewhere. Throw in at the Memorial Park is at 2pm on Sunday.

GAA Injury Benefit Fund

A presentation on the GAA's injury fund was given to all Armagh clubs during the week. The presentation covered all aspects of the club's insurance including property and public liability but we were specifically requested to make the following details known to our playing membership:

Who is Covered? When?

- Claims must be made on the Claims Online system within 60 days of the injury occurring. Contact the club secretary who will help you through the process.
- Benefits are payable following accidental bodily injury sustained by a current registered member participating on a team registered with the fund. The membership year operates from Jan 1 to Dec 31.
- Covered Activities - Official Fixtures / Official Supervised Training /Sanctioned Challenge Matches only
- Cover locations – Island of Ireland playing / training activities only
- Benefits are recoverable in respect of treatment undertaken in the Island of Ireland only
- Cover is in place to supplement personal cover and is only available in respect of otherwise unrecoverable benefits. All playing members have a responsibility to ensure they have cover in place to meet their own specific needs

Key Benefits

- Medical – Max €4500 - first €100 not covered
- Dental – Max €4500 - first €100 not covered
- Loss of Wages (basic net wage only less social welfare)
 - Week 1 – not covered
 - Weeks 2 – 26 - Max €300
 - Claims for over 8 weeks subject to independent medical review
